Finals

The day went extremely well & a number of clubs had caddies & supporters attend. It gave the conclusion of the Pennant season a fitting finale & all that attended felt the day was special.

The concept to change the Pennant to be decided by a Final in 2022 for all divisions, was met with a good deal of scepticism & criticism from quite a number of the members, but I was extremely pleased with how everything turned out & thought it was a fitting finale to quite a difficult season. My goal was to bring back some excitement to the Pennant in all divisions & see players compete with it all on the line. I think this was the experience for all that attended the Finals day at Hawks Nest.

I had booked all the carts at Hawks Nest for the finals & allocated them evenly across all teams. I asked for all team captains to send me their request for the maximum number that they required. I then allocated the carts & thankfully all that wanted one got one. Some clubs requested more than others but initially, all were allocated an equal number. I felt this was the only fair way.

The presentation was done in 2 sections with Division 1 & 2 completed first & then Division 3 & Bronze concluded later on when all matches had come in. Speeches were made by the Captains & Pennant medals were given out to all with players introduced & photos taken for the website. This worked really well.

I would like to make a special mention of Maitland GC for their very first win of the Division 1 Pennant. They were the stand out team all season in Division 1, & were rightly the favourite going into the final. Treasurer's Report:

The year-to-date result, as at the 30th June 2022 is a loss of (\$3,885.77), compared to the previous financial year which resulted in a loss of (\$11, 085.45). However, items that need to be taken into consideration is that affiliation fees were waived in the 2021 year reducing income by an estimated \$14,000 and in this financial year we provided grants to affiliated clubs for a total of \$8K.

Adjusting for these items would have resulted in a profit of approximately \$3,000 in 2021, given affiliation fees is only an estimate, and a profit \$4,114 in 2022, which equates to a variance of approximately \$1,114. Cancellation of tournaments throughout the past two years would justify this movement year on year.

Our reconciled trading account balance at 30th June 2022 was \$12,482.23 and our term deposit balance remains at \$30,000.

The only events to be held since the last meeting in February, are the Committee Day held at Shortland Waters on 21st February, which ran at a loss of (\$522.93) and this was as a result of the discounted entry fees offered by the district committee. The other event was the finals play-off held at Hawks Nest for the end of Pennant season and the cost of running the play off amounted to \$1,433.59. The majority of this cost was for green fees. Thanks goes to Spinal Symmetry for sponsoring the cost of the medals presented to the winning teams on the day.

Invoices for affiliation fees for the 2022/2023 year have been forwarded to all clubs. Payment was due by 1st July, however, to date we have only received payments from the following clubs: Merewether, Murrurundi, Toronto, Shortland Waters and Beresfield. It would be appreciated if representatives from unpaid clubs could follow up on the outstanding fees, to ensure their members are eligible to play in district events.

Our Mixed Foursomes event is to be held on the 10th July, 2022 and we much appreciate sponsorship of \$1,000 received from the NHDGA to assist in the cost of holding this event.

Financials for the year ended 30th June 2022 will be provided to our auditors in the coming months in preparation for the November AGM when the audited accounts will be made available. However, I anticipate there will be little or no change to the results provided in this report.
